

Today Radio Carousel is celebrating its second birthday, and the last twelve months have certainly been hectic, exciting and eventful. But most of all, it was satisfying, for it was a year in which our efforts to provide a local Radio Service was brought that much closer with the publishing of our Survey whic officially confirmed what we at the Station have known for some time — the vast listenership that tunes in daily to our programmes. The Survey reflected the tremendous popularity of Radio Carousel throughout the community, a community to which we have tried to make a substantial contribution. It has always been our policy to make the facilities of this Station available to the community in every area of our coverage. We have helped and will continue to help the social, charitable and sporting organisations and indeed anyone who has a worthwhile message to impart. From an entertainment point of view, our phone-ins on various programmes gave everybody an equal opportunity of participating, in either winning prizes of just saying 'hello' on the air to a friend or relative.

The latter part of the year saw Phase II of Radio Carousel when we introduced our VHF Stereo transmissions. It was a big step in the further development of the Station and opened up a whole new field.

In going into our third year we face the future with confidence. We feel any legislation that will officially introduce local radio cannot overlook the Station's contribution to the community, a community that seems fully behind our efforts.

Meet The

Ray Stone is Station Manager and also head of the News Department, but is best known for the daily Ray Stone Show from 9.00 — 11. a.m. in which he has many interesting personalities as guests. His interview with Cardinal O'Fiach drew one of the biggest mail response of the year, and the programme was subsequently repeated, "Without doubt, my highlights of the year have been my meetings with Cardinal, Tomas O'Fiach, especially a half hour interview which I did in June of last year, in which he spoke of his early memories of Dundalk, and his boyhood days in South Armagh."

Ray did another programme that could not be repeated because of its spontanaeity: "1979 of course will go down in history as the year the Holy Father, Pope John Paul II visited our shores, and I feel Very proud to have been associated with a programme which we transmitted on the eve of the visit. It began innocently enough, with a suggestion that we should talk to to some of the people who had anything to do with the visit to Killineer. From there it was escalated, with Hugh Hardy and Mike Ahern organising facts, and people to talk to, with the result, that three hours later, we had provided what I still regard as the most comprehensive coverage of the Papal visit to Drogheda." Ray's other great interest is horse racing. He may not be the best tipster, but he is consistent and he was rewarded a few months ago.

"March of this year saw a long cherished ambition of mine fulfilled, with a visit to the National Hunt three day Festival Meeting at Cheltenham. During that visit, I interviewed such notable people in the racing game as Tommy Carberry, John Joe O'Neill, trainer Mick O'Toole, and commentator Peter O'Sullivan. We carried live reports each morning, with special emphasis on local owners and trainers, and interviews with many of the local people who had made the hourney there. All in all, it has been the most exciting 12 months of my life."

Hugh Sands Hugh Sands is the newest member of the Carousel team. Hugh's "Twillight Jig," on Sunday 8,00 — 10.00 p.m. is devoted to Irish Music, both the traditional and balled variety. From Mayobridge, he is a brother of the Sands Family, well known in traditional music circles. He spent many years in Canada and presented a television programme on a local station in Ottowe, which was an outlet for Irish music there.

Penny Palmer presents the very popular "Children's Corner," every Saturday morning. What started as an early morning "filler" has now blossomed into a two hour Show, crammed full of requests and dedications, mostly for children celebrating birthdays. In addition, every third week, she presents Late Night Radio and combines her "on air" activities with her job in Carousel advertising.

Shav Breslin is Radio Carousel's Sportscaster and every evening at 6.25 gives a full roundup of local national and international sportsnews with on-the-spot interviews and phone-in reports. His intimate involvement in sport and familiarity with sporting personalities has enabled him to regularly include exclusive sports stories. Every possible type of sporting activity gets his attention and he has visited numerous sporting venues both at home and abroad. As he says himself "my assignments over the past year have varied from standing ankle-deep in mud at a winter crosscountry meeting to scribbling notes in a lurching taxi cab hurtling 'kamikaze style' through rush hour Amsterdam, But that visit to Holland and Dundalk's epic performances against Linfield and Glasgow Celtic in the European Cup must rank as one of the year's highlights.'

Shay also went on a weekend trip to London with the Louth football team on the invitation of the County Board. "Another highlight, certainly a unique opportunity to get to know the team from the inside." As last on the late-night Radio programme, Shay features easy listening sounds and 'phone-ins' with people ranging from teenagers to grannies.

A DAY IN THE LIFE OF RADIO CAROUSEL

6.30 a.m. Outside all is quiet and still as the dawn of another day breaks, inside the Studios of Radio Carousel another day has already begun with the arrival of Mike Ahern. His practised eyes quickly survey the panel of controls. Defity he flicks a switch here and there. Satisfied that all is in order he busies himself in selecting his first record of the morning. As the hands of the Studio clock approach 7.00 a.m. he cues up the Carousel theme and "Good Morning" jingle. Directly on 7.00 he welcomes itseners to the station and another day's broadcasting has begun.

8.30 a.m. The time has passed quickly for Mike ad libbing his way through the show, selecting his records as he goes, answering the phone, putting our commercials and playing requests. When Ray Stone arrives there's just time for a quick good morning' then he is checking through the early morning news stories deciding which are the important ones he'll use in the 9 o'clock bulletin. This done, he sets about selecting records for his Show — "more punk records again today?" asks Mike. "That's right," rejoins a straight faced Ray. The wise cracks continue right up 'till 9.00 when Mike signs off

and Ray begins his News and Programme.

10.00 a.m. Ray Stone is one air quickly putting his Quiz contestants at their ease. In Carousel's Office Complex, Managing Director Hugh Hardvis already behind his desk making and taking phone calls, dealing with the day to deal the control of the control of the morning has been settle — "who'll get the tea?" they're soon behind their desk Carol downstairs in the front office answering the steady stream of phone calls and queries from people calling in Advertising Co-ordinator Bernei is already preparing the next day's Advertising Schedule, Hugh's Section 1, and the control of the morning through the accounts with Hugh, while Anne is typing her way through a pile of letters and correspondence. Kleran Murray arrives shortly and quickly prepares his 11.00 requests programme. This gives him a few minutes to spare and check that the second studio will be available after 12.00 o'clock — he has some guests to interveiw for the 'Carousel Tonight' Programme.

11. 55 a.m. Against a background of phones ringing, non-stop typing and wise-cracking, Ray Stone is at the news desk preparing the 1 o'clock news. Shane Mullen has filted in to report on another success Carousel Roadshow Disco the previous night, before disappearing again. Mike Ahern and Bernie are listening to the playback of some advertisements Mike has recorded and discussing with one of the Advertising Reps, how best to put together a commercial for a prospective advertiser who wants special effects on the advertisement. Suddenly "Don't Panic" shouts a red faced and panting Hugh Hardy as he dashes past with headphones trailing and records flying. It's a minute to "Country Oli" and he can't find his theme tune. Eventually it's unearthed in the Studio and with seconds to spare, Kleran Murray ushers his guests into Studio 2 for interview, Mike Ahern selects records and lingles for his Lunchtime Express and Ray Stone pounds a type-writer at the newsdesk to meet his one o'clock deadline, and as he calmly reads the news a tired Hugh Hardy exits for some well earned lunch as do some of the office staff – the rest will be taking phone calls which never seem to let up.

3.00 p.m. Shane Mullen has just begun his programme. Mike Ahern is sorting our records, tiddying his desk, checking on work for the next day, his day is almost over. No let up though in the hub bub in the office. Several advertising resp. where come in with advertisements which Bernie must book into the next day's schedule. Hugh Hardy is meeting prizewinners of his Quiz in the downstrising office and Ray is back behind the next day's the afternoor wars on Shay Breslin

comes in to begin his sports news and Kieran Murray is editing tapes for the "Carousel Tonight" programme.

6.00 p.m. Ray reads the final news of the day. Most of the office staff have finished their work and Shay Breslin is telling Kieran what interview he wants him to slot in during the Sports News. While Kieran is presenting his Show his hands move at speed cueing up advertisements, records and interviews as well as leafing through notices which have to be read out. There's near panic when he can't find one of the Sports interviews on cue — however, Shay reads the situation well and continues talking slowly while Kieran sorts out his problem.

8.00 p.m. Another action packed 'Country Call' has been completed and Kieran presents his Rock, Pop and Disco Show, while Hugh tidies the studio of the requests, records, sleeves which have accumulated during 'Country Call.' The phones still ring shrilly and continue through the night, and the Late Night Programme, with Shay Breslin helping listeners unwind with easy listening music and chatting on the air and on the phone about any and every topic. Finally it's 12.00 cut the Carousel Theme, Goodnight and closedown —another successful day's brandcasting is over.

In a major survey carried out, by Landsdowne of Irish Marketing Surveys Ltd., within a 35 mile radius of Dundalk, in a seven day period in January, the Survey showed that:

- 69.8% of the population of the Dundalk area, or 7 out of every 10 people listen to Radio Carousel on a daily basis. This figure compares with 11% for RTE 2.
- In Northern Ireland, 22% listen to Radio Carousel. This compares with 9% for RTE 1 and 4% for RTE 2
- 3. Radio Carousel is 121/2% ahead of Downtown Radio in the surveyed area.
- 1 in 4 people listen to late night radio on Radio Carousel. This is 2½ times more than Radio Luxembourg and almost 3 times more than RTE 2.
- 5. Radio Carousel has a balanced audience. The age bracket is as follows:

15 - 24 31% 25 - 34 33% 35 - 49 36%

- 6. The biggest single category of listener is the housewife.
- The most listened to programme on Radio Carousel is "Country Call" between 12.00 1.00 p.m.
 88% of the population in the surveyed area has VHF Radio, Radio Carousel also broadcasts on
- VHF Stereo.
