# Alncora scandal

BRITISH ARMY FILES relating to the Kincora Boys Home homosexual scandal, have been removed from Army headquarters in the North — to prevent a top British policeman examining them.

As the Chief Constable of Sussex, Sir George Terry, was arriving in the North last week to conduct his investigation into the Kincora scandal and subsequent cover-up, the top secret files were being removed from British Army command headquarters at Thievpal barracks, Lisburn, Co. Antrim.

British Army files which detail military knowledge about the Kincora sex scandal have gone missing from Northern Ireland Command HQ in Thievpal Barracks, Lisburn, Co. Antrim.

A British police chief, Sir George Terry, Chief Constable of Sussex, was expected to examine them as part of his probe into the RUC cover-up of the scandal, last week, says an RUC source.

The files contained thousands of documents on the work of the Army Information Policy Depart-

ment — the cover name of the Psychological Warfare Section which had its office on the ground floor of the New Admin. Building at the barracks, across the corridor from

the Army Press Office. The files are believed to have been flown to London for safe keeping, but Defence Department sources have told newsmen they know nothing about them.

Most of the papers related black progaganda smears against Northern politicians and paramilitary leaders.

One file gave details of meetings in Clifton

Street Orange Hall each Wednesday night at which the Loyalist assassination group, Tara planned its activities.

According to the file, which was shown to several newsmen on separate occasions in -1976, three of those who attended the meetings were close associates of Rev. lan Paisley.

Two of them were said to be homosexuals.

#### Named

One of those named in the file was Billy McGrath, the housefather at Kincora who was jailed last year for offences against boys in his care.

Another of the files which is missing is one on the Catholic Defence Volunteers" — a bogus group set up by the black progaganda unit to link certain Catholic politicians

with violence. SUNDAY JOURNAL has obtained a document from that file which says that the Catholic Defence Volunteers are prepared to attack Protestant schools and nursery schools in revenge for sectarian assassinations.

The statement has deliberate misspellings -'untolled grief", and a telephone code word "RATs" is given.



The bogus statement goes on to claim that the names of those planning sectarian attacks on Catholics have been given to the Catholic Defence Volunteers 'by our intelligence sources, which include a number of reasonably well known politicians, civil servants, a few members of the RUC itself, honest Protestants and our own agents, all of whom are very reliable."

#### Involved

Later, British Army sources suggested that a lawyer who is a member of the SDLP was involved with the CDV — although the group existed only in the imagination of its black progaganda author.

Some journalists claim they were shown documents from the files in 1975 which named McGrath as a homosexual and linked him with the

terror group Tara. And that is why Sir

George Terry wanted to see the files — to discover when it was officially known about McGrath, and what his links with

military intelligence were. But the Defence Ministry in London is not prepared to discuss specific files.

A spokesman said: "In the normal course of events, documents not considered important are destroyed, while classified files are stored in the archives".

A Unionist newspaper has quoted "sources" as saying they are doubtful if the documents ever reached the Defence Department after they left Lisburn.

#### Files

One of those who revealed the existence of the files is The Times of London reporter, Bob Fisk, a former British journalist

of the Year. In 1976 he reported that British officers had been

told that information about extremist leaders could be taken from private files and leaked to journalists, so as to cause distrust among para-military

groups." The Times said that a secret "press committee" headed by Mr. Michael Cudlipp had been set up at Stormont Castle. The paper said he had confirmed that he headed


the committee but refused to say what his job there was, claiming it was a private matter.

Shortly after the report appeared in The Times, Fisk left his Co. Down home for Dublin. He was visited in his Dublin hotel by an official from the British embassy who threatened him with prosecution under the Official Secrete Act






