EDITORIAL

"The right to communicate with each other is a God given right to be exercised freely and responsibly when we don't infringe on the rights of others . . ."

Kilkenny Community Radio is a unique partnership in communication. It provides community interests with a real say with regard to the scope and content of a communications medium for the first time in Kilkenny's history. K.C.R. is controlled jointly by a Community Committee and the Directors whose initiative and expertise provides the Station.

K.C.R. set out to foster a greater community spirit and an awareness of the individuals obligations within the Community. We make special decisions about items of a cultural and Irish nature and guarantee access to both statutory and voluntary agencies. Voluntary groups are particularly encouraged to provide information about their objectives and activities as a key to greater community awareness and participation.

The publication of this first issue of "For the Record" is a further step in communication. It is published in response to frequent requests for information from individuals who want to know "What's on K.C.R.". This first issue tells you all you want to know about K.C.R. and its programmes from the first week in September to the end of December 1981.

People in the Community are invited to spend six months on a deserted Tropical Island. The programme presents the other side of the public person – (Fridays each week at 3 p.m.).

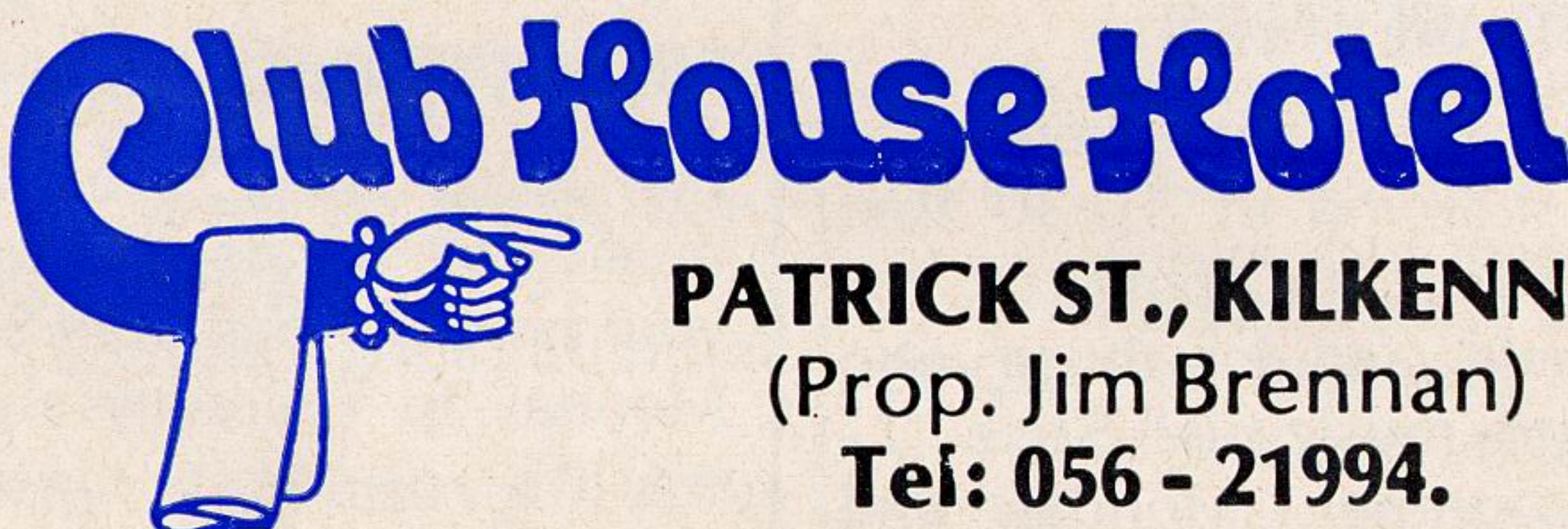

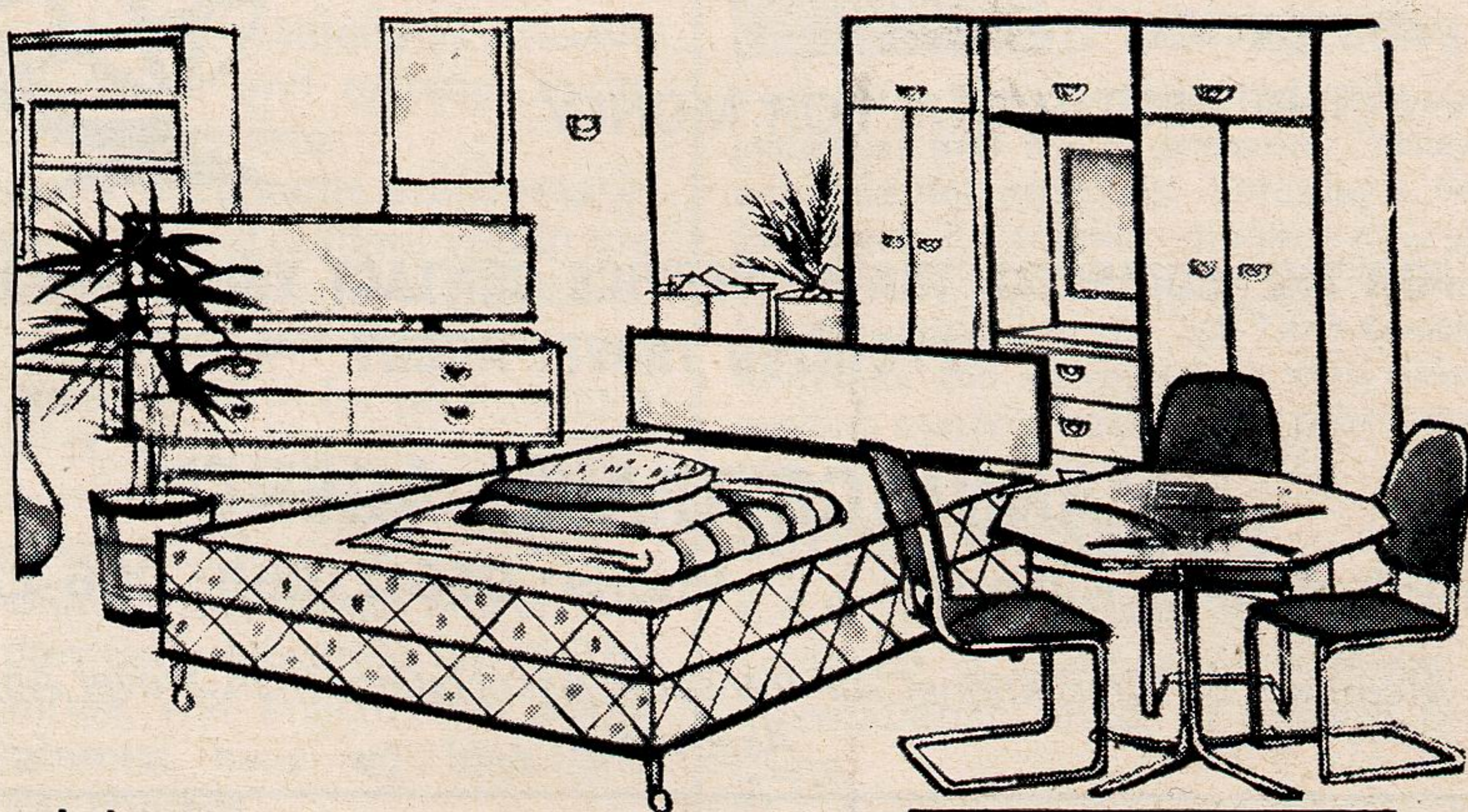

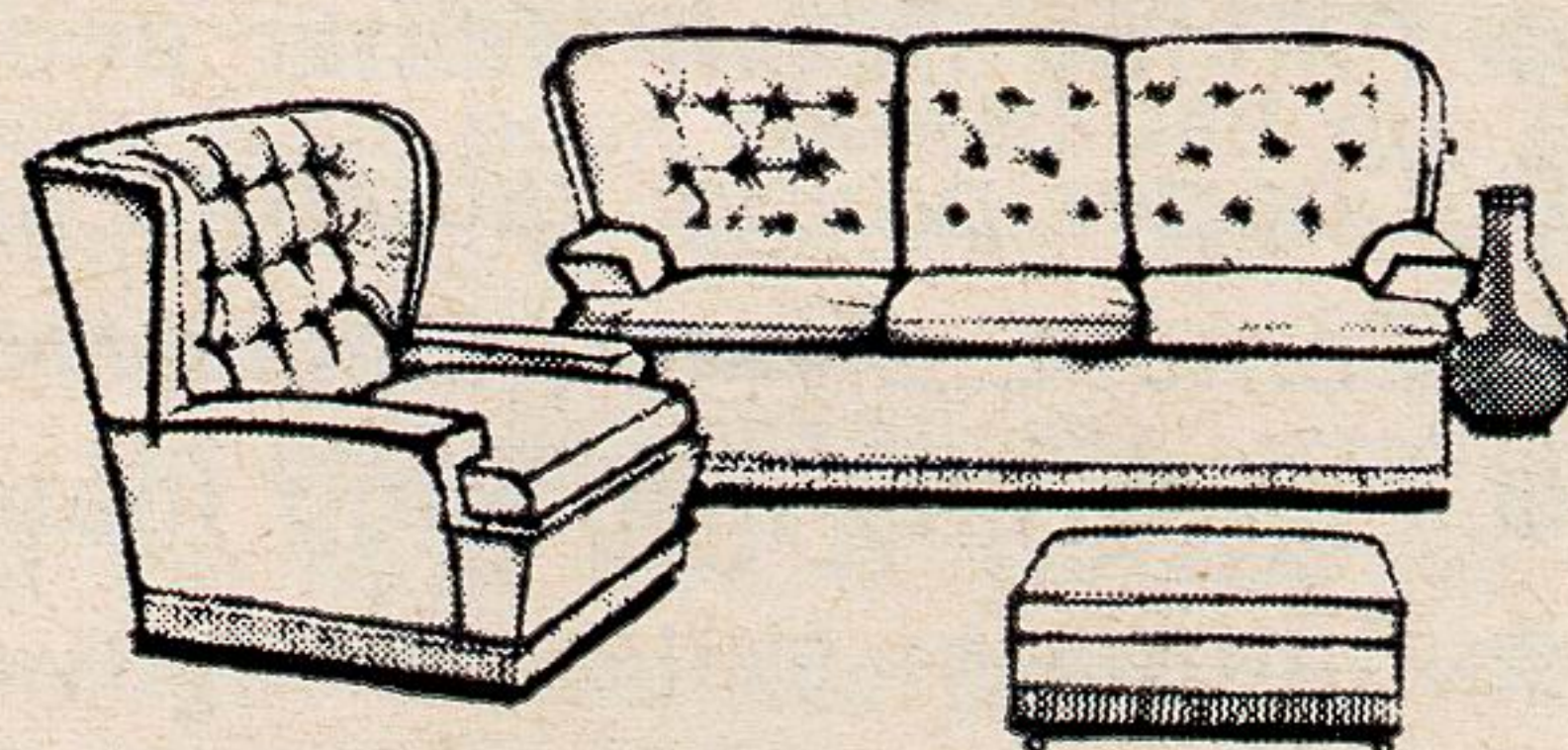
