

RADIO ELEANOR 1170kHz: 16 Stockbridge Street, Anfield, Liverpool L5 6PB.

This station now seem to have settled down to a schedule which reads:- Saturdays 10am - 10pm, and Sundays 10am - 5pm. On Saturday, Paul Rogers announced that Tony Reeve was a Sunday only DJ, and that Barry Cullen would be leaving the station for a while, as he would be working away from the area. Heard on Saturday were Paul Rogers, Barry Cullen, Mark Wright, Tony Carr, Paul Rogers and Pete Davies with a two-hour stint in that order. Heard on Sunday were Tony Reeve, Barry Cullen, Mark Wright and Paul Rogers. Barry did a one-hour show, all the others doing two hours each. The station has been requesting "demo" tapes from "would be" DJs, and has a limited supply of car stickers available. One sticker per person on receipt of a stamped addressed envelope to the mailing address.

CHANNEL FIVE 1242kHz: 3 Palm Grove, Cloughton, Birkenhead, Merseyside L45 1TE

This station seems to have signed-on a little late on Saturday, as they were not noted at 10am. Their normal Gary Smith, Pete Williams, Nick Catford, Dave Graham and Matt Black line-up was heard, but there seems to have been some shuffling of times, as Steve West was not heard. I believe that this station operated all night, but were not listened to after 10:15pm. On Sunday, from about 10:57am were heard Gary Smith, Pete Williams (who accused SCR of jamming Channel 5 on the previous Sunday), Steve West, Nick Catford, Dave Graham, Matt Black and Frank Xerox. Steve West probably did the 1am to 3am close-down show.

STORETON COMMUNITY RADIO 1026kHz: 30 Bridle Close, Ford Estate, Birkenhead, Merseyside L43 -

For the time being, this station seems to be a "weekend only" station and is obviously having a few problems with its equipment (and its frequency?). On Saturday, a very strong carrier was noted on 1026kHz at 12:20pm. Shortly after this, SCR were heard. Noted were Paul Woods with a repeat of the tape played last weekend at 1:18pm and Miss Chris Sinclair at 3:20pm. At 5pm, SCR had gone, but there was tremendous interference to Radio Norway on 1314kHz, which I suspect might have been SCR attempting to transmit on 1296kHz, but the interference had gone after just a few minutes. On Sunday, a very strong carrier was noted on 1026kHz at 11:28am, but this had been switched off at 11:52am. SCR were not noted until 3:09pm, when the John Sniff show was in progress. He announced that a "lot of people had left the station", but I suspect that he meant to say that they were not immediately available. Later he said that it was amazing how quickly the personnel "disappeared" when the station was off the air, and how much quicker they disappeared when equipment was being repaired!! At 4:05pm a joint "Mad Mike/Paul Woods" show was heard, but at both 5:25pm and 6:23pm it seems to have been Paul Woods alone. The station had gone from the air. Whenever heard, the signal was very strong and the modulation was nice and clear, so it is difficult to imagine what difficulties they may have experienced with equipment.

ABC RADIO 96.25 MHz stereo FM: 4 Glencairn Road, Old Swan, Liverpool L13 2AL

This station was heard Friday night/Saturday morning with Kevin Palmer handing over to Tom Lodge at midnight. In his pirate radio news-slot, Tom Lodge said that in the Telecom raid on SCR, "some very, very nice disco equipment was confiscated". He commiserated with them, and went on to say that in future they would have the sense to post "look-outs" when they were on the air. He also said that Telecom were seen in the vicinity of both Radio Eleanor and Channel 5 on the same day, but that the latter didn't seem to notice. It was also reported that the Telecom men who carried out the raid were not known locally, and it is speculated that the authorities have drafted in "specialist" outsiders for their "pirate-busting" operations. On Saturday night, it was clear that things are beginning to happen on this station. Heard at 10:04pm was "Keith" (of KDA?) who announced the station's presenters as himself, Kevin Palmer, Phil James, Eric Monaghan and Tom Lodge, with the station's engineer being Andy Davies. Later, Eric Monaghan was heard, followed by Tom Lodge. The present schedule, based on announcements made "on air" seems to be: Friday 10pm - 11pm Phil James; 11pm - 12pm Kevin Palmer and 12pm - 1am Tom Lodge. Saturday 10pm - 11pm "Keith", 11pm - 12pm Eric Monaghan and 12pm - 1am Tom Lodge.

STATION "M" INTERNATIONAL 1413kHz: 78 Brunswick Court, Birkenhead, Merseyside L41 6LW.

Were heard on Sunday with continuous music Tx warm up from 11:54am. Signal this week had increased from S $\frac{1}{2}$  to S2. They opened at noon with the Ray Rockford show till 2pm, then Dave Wilson till 4pm, when Roger Dee appeared. John Freeman was on the air at 5:30pm and he signed-off at about 6:45pm. At 6:09pm, John Mitchell was heard and at 7:47pm, Roger Dee closed the station down with a long-winded and somewhat silly spell.

CENTRAL RADIO INTERNATIONAL 1385kHz: 18 Glynn Street, Orrell, Bootle, Merseyside L20 6DF.

Signed-on at 10am on Sunday with the Jeff Stone show, followed



by Jim Brown and Mark Evans. After this, the schedule seems to have been disrupted due to "missing" DJs. Jim Brown was heard again at 2:55pm and Mark Evans at 3:39pm. Mark Evans said that Steve Tyler would be along at 4:30pm, with a two-hour rock show.. The latter was heard at both 5pm and 6:10pm. Jeff Stone was back again at both 7:37pm and 7:54pm. The station announced an 8pm close-down, but this was not observed

RADIO MERSEYWAVES 94.8 MHz FM and 1197kHz AM: No mailing address announced.  
This station signed-on at 6pm on Sunday, and for the first time acknowledged transmission on 1197kHz by way on an "on air" reception reports to "transmitter at location 02" As on other weekends, the only DJs to be heard were Bert Williams and Paul Jay. They were announcing a mid-night close-down and had gone from the air by 12:09pm
