The station was noted on Friday night with Paul Rogers 5pm-7pm and John Freeman 7pm-9pm(announced). The latter DJ was still on the air at 9:40pm but the station was not checked after this time. It was during the latter show that the FM frequency was announced, and when checked, a really good signal was found. The station opened at 10am on Saturday, with the Tony Reeve show, but the rest of the schedule was not determined. Mark Wright is ill with scarlet fever and Barry Cullen is on holiday, so most of the programming has been done by Paul Rogers and John Freeman, who were both heard outside their normal hours. On Sunday, Chris Taylor, the new DJ did 10am-1pm; Paul Rogers 1pm-2pm; Bert Williams 2pm-3pm; John Freeman 3pm-5pm and Paul Rogers 5pm-5:20pm. The station say that they have come to an agreement with Radio Merseywaves, and a number of changes have taken place between the stations. Paul Rogers said that they hope shortly to extend their broadcasting hours and to feature a number of new DJs. They are still requesting "demo" tapes from 'would-be' DJs.

The station appeared on the air on Sunday at 6:30pm, side 144 9AY with Bert Williams apologising for the lateness. He said that he had been down at the MW transmitter location sorting out a "link" problem. The news from the station is that Bert Williams now has a 50% interest in Radio Elenore and under an agreement between the stations a number of changes have taken place. The station's MW frequency has now moved from 1197kHz to 1170kHz, and the programmes will be on both FM frequencies. Also, Radio Merseywaves will carry the Radio Elenore advertisements until 8:30pm on Sunday night. It was also announced that within a short time, they hoped that Radio Elenore would use the frequencies until 6pm, when Radio Merseywaves would take over. I forgot to mention earlier that the Radio Elenore AM signal is back up to S3, and remains the same for the Merseywaves signal.

This station has been on the air each evening, but seem to have had a few problems. General sign-off time seems to be 9pm, although on Wednesday evening they have appeared to have stayed on the air until midnight, playing a tape of KFM Radio in Stockport. This was a very welcome chance to hear a station that can not normally be heard on my own FM gear, but I was very surprised at the amount of advertising carried during the Simon Richards Show!! On thursday night, Steve Tyler was heard to announce during his show that the broadcast was a "Test transmission". They closed down at 9pm, but opened shortly after this with Rick Dane also announcing the broadcast as as a "test transmission". The station were not heard at all on Saturday. They were on the air with a very good signal by 9:30am on Sunday until 10am, when Steve Bishop seemed to take over. Rick Dane and Phil Clarke then seemed to have done a joint show, until noon, when the station's normal weekday schedule seems to have come into operation until 9pm, when Rick Dane took over from Steve Tyler. Earlier, Steve Bishop announced that the station would be on the air until midnight, or possibly later.

The station opened at 12:30pm on Saturday and operated a slightly revised schedule. Heard were Pete Williams; Steve West and Bruce(?). The station was not checked after 7:20pm. Sign on time on Sunday was not noted, but heard were .. to 3pm Pete Williams; 3pm-4pm Dave Ernst; 4pm-6pm Steve West; 6pm-8pm Dick Turk; 8pm -10pm Dave Graham. Remainder of the schedule is presumably as normal.

This station went off the air at 7pm on Monday night, side L49 9A2. so that the DJs could attend the "Under 18s" night out, of which, no details are available. They are still fulfilling their quota of broadcasting hours, but the DJ line-up still seems to be somewhat variable, although the evening programmes are largely as planned.
