First some belated news of Storeton Community Radio's Under-18s night-out on 11th June. The response was so great that MA BAKER's club shut the doors after approximately 750 youngsters had been admitted. Their next Under-18s night-out will be held on 7th July, but the venue for this has been changed to Tranmere Rovers Social Club, Prenton Park, which is a much larger venue and should ensure that no one is locked out. Early attendance at the Over-18s night-out on 18th June was not very good. About 100 to 150 persons were present by 9:45pm, but with a steady trickle still coming in. SCR were not expecting much of a crowd before 10:30pm, and I understand that this was so. Apart from the SCR crew, the only representatives of the other stations met were Paul Rogers and John Freeman of R. Elenore, who both said that most of the other stations, as well as the rest of their own DJs turned up later.

Radio Elenore's own night-out for the Over-18s will take place on 7th July at the BRADFORD HOTEL, Tithebarn Street, Liverpool(our #th of Pall Mall) in the Mediterranean Bar.

RADIO ELEMORE 1170kHz & 104MHz: 16, Stockbridge Street, Anfield, Liverpool L5 6PB.

This station have not been on FM this weekend, and the explanation was that they have "lost" their FM link at the last minute. The station was on the air on Friday night from 5pm to midnight, Saturday from 10am to midnight and Sunday from 10am to 5:55pm. Paul Rogers' Free Radio News programme just before close-down on Sunday appears to now have been dis-continued. Reception this weekend has been marred by a lot of crackling noises, and it was explained that the standby transmitter in use would not accept the full power of the modulator, and that a lot of arcing was taking place. It was promised that this will be sorted out by next week, and that reception will also return on FM. The station seems to have had a full complement of DJs this week.

RADIO MERSEYWAVES 1170kHz & 94.8MHz: 23, Birnam Road, Poulton, Wallasey, Merseyside L44 9AY.

The station signed-on on Sunday on both AM and FM frequencies, with apologies for the crackling on 1170kHz. A revised schedule was announced from this weekend. New schedule is Bert Williams 6pm to 9pm, then Paul Jay from 9pm to close-down between 11pmmand 11:30pm. Apparently, an appeal for listeners to let the station know what hours they would like the station to operate met with zero response, and Bert has decided to close-down early and concentrate on the proper setting-up of the station equipment. By 9:30pm the FM outlet seemed to be working a little intermittantly

CHANNEL FIVE 1242kHz: 23, Rice Hey Road, Egremont, Wallasey, Merseyside L44 ODX.

This station was not noted until 2:30pm on Saturday, when they appeared to be nursing a very sick transmitter. Reception was very intermittant and accompanied by a lot of other noises. By 3:45pm, they seemed to be operating normally, but with continuous music, although a little later they had disappeared and were not subsequently heard. On Sunday they signed-on at noon and seem to have operated noon-3pm Pete Williams, 3pm-6pm Steve West; 6pm-8pm Stuart Davies; 8pm-10pm Dave Graham; 10pm-Midnight Frank Xerox, although subsequent announcements say that Stuard Davies did 7pm-8pm and that Dave Graham's show was cut to 1½ hours by a transmitter fault.

The station closed down at 7pm on Monday night to allow Merseyside L49 9AQ. the DJs to attend the night-out. The schedule now seems to be settling down to a more regular pattern now that recent illnesses are wearing off, and the station is announcing 20-hour per day operation. During the week, they have been noted well before their previous 8pm sign-on on a number of occasions. On Sundays, Pablo Brad's reggae show seems to have been extended from 3pm-7pm, with Phil Davies not noted between 5pm and 7pm. This weekend, Wayne Scott was not heard on Sunday, with Little Di/Sandie Babe/Lottle Di & Sandie Babe filling-in from noon to 3pm.

RADIO ATLANTIS 936kHz & 102.7MHz: 150, Rake Lane, Wallasey, Merseyside L44 lWU.

This station appears to have operated normally this week, without any of last week's "test" transmission announcements being heard. From Saturday, the FM relay on 104MHz has been resumed, although this latter signal does not seem to be as strong as previous, and suffers some distortion. Announcements from the station suggest that new legislation concerning pirate radio may have been passed during the week, but details have not been heard. It also seems that Steve Tyler may be leaving the station from this weekend.

STATION "M" INTERNATIONAL 90.2MHz: 78, Brunswick Court, Birkenhead, Merseyside I41 6LW

A good signal was noted from 12:10pm on Sunday, but this came to an abrupt end at 12:50pm. Format was continuous music. The signal re-appeared later, again with the continuous music format, but sounding as though adjustments were been made to the transmitter. It dis-appeared shortly afterwards and was not subsequently noted.
