

Storeton Community Radio are holding another "Over-18s" night-out at Ma Baker's Club on Bank Holiday Monday, 27th August. This will be followed by Central Radio's night-out on Wednesday 29th August at the Oakfield Hotel, Oakfield Road, Anfield

Radio Elenore: 1179kHz; 16, Stockbridge Street, Anfield, Liverpool, L5 6PB

This station appears to have operated its announced Friday/Saturday/Sunday schedule and seems to be getting back to its regular line-up of presenters now that the holiday season is drawing to a close. As normal, they handed over to Radio Merseywaves at 6pm on Sunday, but they operated a Bank Holiday "Special" from 9am to 9pm on Monday.

Storeton Community Radio: 73, The Meadow, Woodchurch Estate, Birkenhead, Merseyside L45 1026kHz The station seems to still be opening at 8am each day, and -8HX closing down at 4pm the following day. DJ schedule seems to be following a regular pattern, and the station seems to be operating seven days per week without too many problems in spite of a report in the Mail on Sunday (19th Aug) that it is included in the D.T & I's list of their ten "most wanted" stations. On Bank Holiday Monday, at 7pm close-down, Martin "C" announced that they had intended to continue operating while the night-out at Ma Baker's was taking place, but this posed too many problems.

Radio Atlantis: 936kHz: 150, Rake Lane, Wallasey, Merseyside L45 1JW.

This station appears to have operated normally on Monday, Tuesday and Wednesday, but all that was heard shortly before 6pm on Thursday evening was a weak carrier. This had disappeared a short time later, and the station has not been noted over the weekend at all. Hope the problem is only "electrical", as this station is only one of two in the area with seven-day formats.

Central Radio International 1386kHz: 18, Glynne Street, Orrell, Bootle, Merseyside L20 6DF.

This station have not been noted in the evenings, but were on the air over the weekend, possibly with earlier than normal start on Saturday, or maybe an all-night broadcast on Friday night. The line-up of the presenters was not noted. The station was also on-air on Bank Holiday Monday, announcing a 9am to 9pm schedule. They were heard from about 9:10am, but close-down time was not noted. I suspect that this station may now also be operating a seven-day per week schedule that has been promised for some time.

Channel Five: 1242kHz: 23, Rice Hey Road, Egremont, Wallasey, Merseyside L44 ODX.

This station appears to have adhered to its 'Sundays only' format this weekend, and were not noted on Bank Holiday Monday. They seem to have put out their normal broadcasts on Sunday, but timing and line-up of presenters was not noted.

Radio Merseywaves: 98.4MHz; 23, Birnam Road, Poulton, Wallasey, Merseyside L44 9AY.

This station signed-on at 6pm on Sunday, and appeared to followed their normal schedule. Heard were Bert Williams and Paul Jay, but close-down time was not noted. They don't appear to have done any special broadcasting on Bank Holiday Monday, and the AM frequency seemed to be empty after Radio Elenore signed-off.
