MERSEYSIDE FREE RADIO SCENE Week ending Sunday 2nd September 1984

Most of the local stations operated a Bank Holiday service on Monday, and Central Radio reported a good turn out at their night-out on Wednesday night. For the moment, none of the stations appear to have anything "in the pipeline"

CENTRAL RADIO INTERNATIONAL: 1386kHz; 18, Glynne Street, Orrell, Bootle, Merseyside L20 6TF

This station were on the air until 8pm on Bank Holiday Monday, and also from 9am to 8pm on Tuesday and Wednesday. The additional broadcasts were presumably to give maximum publicity to their night-out. They were not heard again until the weekend, when they operated their normal hours. A new DJ, Terry Hawkins was heard on Saturday afternoon, apparently taking the place of either "Howie" or Ian Phillips. Reports from the station say that attendance at the Night-out was good, but they admit that a little more in the way of "entertainment" could have been laid on and promise that the next event will take place at a 'club' rather than a 'pub'. The free buffet seems to have been a great success, the food lasting for a whole five minutes.

RADIO ATLANTIS 936kHz: 150, Rake Lane, Wallasey, Merseyside L45 lJW

This station has not now been noted since Wednesday 22nd August.

CHANNEL FIVE 1242kHz: 23, Rice Hey Road, Egremont, Wallasey, Merseyside L44 ODX

This Station did not have a Bank Holiday Monday broadcast. Sunday schedule appears to have been the normal format, but the station was not found when checked at 10:30pm, and appears to have left the air earlier than usual.

RADIO ELENORE 1179kHz: 16, Stockbridge Street, Anfield, Liverpool L5 6PB.

Radio Elenore introduced a couple of new DJs this weekend. They were Colin Sayer and Tony Hayes, neither of whom were heard. On Sunday the signal strength of the station was down to S2, but with excellent modulation. They signed-on late (11:10am) and apologised for various breaks in transmission, although they were on the air at each check. Paul Rogers announced that a number of major changes had taken place at the studio, and that "breaks" were beyond their control. They hope to be back to normal by next week.
