determined. However, the station could not be found by 8:45pm.

RADIO ATLANTIS 102.7MHz: 150, Rake Lane, Wallasey, Merseyside L45 lJW

Various reports say that this station has been heard in the evenings, but it was not noted here until Sunday. It seems to have signed-on at Noon, and the format appears to have been "tests" using tapes of previously broadcast programmes. Heard were Steve Tyler and Roy Stannier. They appear to have closed-down some time around 8pm, and were not heard at 8:45pm check.

MERSEYLAND ALTERNATIVE RADIO 819kHz: PO Box No.9, Moreton, Wirral, Merseyside.

Contrary to last week's report, this station appears to be "testing" seven days per week, Noon to 6pm, and not weekends only. They were heard on Tuesday and Wednesday using 975kHz, but by Saturday they had moved to the "announced" 819kHz. The format seems to be largely taped continuous music, or continuous music with regular IDs and announcements. The station is due to open at 7am on Monday 1st October.

RADIO ELEMORE 1179kHz: 16, Stockbridge Street, Anfield, Liverpool L5 6PB.

This station seems to have reverted to its normal format this weekend, ie Friday 10am-Midnight, Saturday 10am-Midnight and Sunday 10am-6pm. The signal on Friday and Saturday was well modulated and back up to full strength, but the DJ line-up and close-down times were not noted. On Sunday, they opened up at 10am, but disappeared shortly after 11am, and were not heard again. Later, on Radio Merseywaves, Bert Williams said that Elenore have been having some bad luck over the last few weeks. This week's problems were announced as being due to a change of transmitter location and "a shortage of aerial hardware that is difficult to obtain".

RADIO MERSEYWAVES 94.8MHz & 1179kHz: 23, Birnam Road, Poulton, Wallasey, Merseyside L44 9M This station opened at 6pm on Sunday, with Bert Williams apologising for the low signal strength on FM and for the absence of signal on AM. He also said that there would be no Tina Christian Show this weekend, but that a tape of a previous show might be played instead. The schedule was not determined, but at 11:45pm Paul Jay handed over to Bert Williams, who announced an "extended" programme to fit in all the phone-in acknowledgements.
