It has been quite a blank week with Storeton Community Radio still being off the air following the raid on Thursday 6th December, and just two stations being heard on Sunday only.

RADIO MERSEYWAVES 1179kHz & 1242kHz: 18, Mallard Way, Moreton, Wirral, Merseyside L46 - 7SL Sign-on time was not noted but probably llam or so. They featured mainly continuous music with "Engineering test transmission" announcements at intervals. On the hours of noon and lpm, Burt Williams said that in an effort to minimise continental interference the station would operate until 5pm on 1179kHz, then change over to 1233kHz for the evening. Heard were:- Burt Williams lpm-2pm; Paul Jay 2pm-4pm; Paul Anderson 4pm-5pm. At 5pm they changed frequency to 1242kHz, not as announced, and format seems to have been continuous music with "test" announcements. Close-down time was not noted but was announced as 10:30pm to 1lpm. The station say that this will be their format until Christmas, when they will change to "1233kHz" permanently. Please note the change of mailing address.

CENTRAL RADIO INTERNATIONAL 1404kHz: 18, Glynne Street, Orrell, Bootle, Merseyside L20 6DF.

This station was on the air on Sunday only, with an extremely weak signal. Neither opening nor closing times were noted, but the schedule appeared to be: Jim Browne 10am-Noon; Mark Evans Noon-2pm and Phil Davies 2pm-4pm. It seems that the station have not yet built a new amp, but they announce that things will be back to normal by next weekend.
