

MERSEYSIDE FREE RADIO SCENE    Week ending Sunday 23rd December 1984

There isn't a lot to report again this week, with just two stations operating on Sunday only.

CENTRAL RADIO INTERNATIONAL 1404kHz: 18, Glynne Street, Orrell, Bootle, Merseyside L20 6DF

The signal from this station is now extremely weak and barely being heard on a pocket-portable receiver. They appear to have opened up shortly after noon, with Jim Browne in the chair. He was followed, I think, by Mark Evans, but reception was very poor and voices were difficult to distinguish. They seem to have closed-down early and were not found at 4:04pm.

RADIO MERSEYWAVES 1179kHz & 1242kHz: 18, Mallard Way, Moreton, Wirral, Merseyside L46 7SL

This station opened at 11am with continuous music (and a few announcements and IDs) until 1pm. The schedule was then:- 1pm-2pm Burt Williams; 2pm-4pm Paul Jay; 4pm-5pm Paul Anderson(?). The latter seems to be calling himself Paul Henderson, but the other presenters appear to be announcing him as Paul Anderson. The station was still on 1179kHz at 4:50pm, but were not noted on their other frequency at 6:20pm. Suspect that I searched for them on the wrong side of BBC Radio 3, so I don't know whether they closed down early without moving frequency or not.
