

Week ending Sunday 14th July 1985

Both Storeton Community Radio and Radio Merseywaves have extended their hours this week. Station announcements have not been completely reliably and some parts of their schedules have been missed. Both now announce Friday, Saturday and Sunday operation but SCR were not heard this Friday. Central Radio International have not been noted at all.

STORFTON COMMUNITY RADIO 1026kHz:

This station is slowly finding its feet again and has introduced a number of new DJs. Most "slots" have been of three-hour stints, but the station say that they hope to shortly get back to two-hour periods. They were not noted on Friday evening. On Saturday they were first noted at 10:40am, but probably opened at 10:00am. Heard were:- 10am(?) - 1pm Brian "C"; 1pm-4pm John Sniff; 4pm-7pm Uncle Ern; 7pm-10pm Mike Martin, standing in for Martin "C"; 10pm-Midnight Jill Jackson. The station, according to announcements heard during the day, were due to close down at midnight, but at 12:15am, Jill Jackson was still on the air, saying that she would be carrying on till Joe Williams turned up. Joe was supposed to be starting Sunday off at 7am, but the station wasn't checked till 10:15am. Heard were:- 10:15-1pm Boxcar KG (a new DJ presenting a C&W show; 1pm-2pm Andy Sloane; 2pm-3pm John Sniff; 3pm-4pm Jeff Jones; 4pm-7pm Brian "C"; 7pm- ??? Martin "C". The change-over time wasn't noted, but by 9:55pm Mike Martin was on-air till Midnight, when Mad Mike took over. Martin "C" and John Sniff were due to present a joint show after Mad Mike had finished but this was not noted.

RADIO MERSEY-WAVES 1242kHz:

The station was first noted at 5:20pm on Friday evening, when "Tara's" show was in progress until 6pm. At 6pm, Paul Jay said that they were having "audio" problems and broadcast an appeal for Burt Williams to bring a new "needle" to the studio. He said that they would continue by utilising the tape deck playing Sunday afternoon's "Paul Jay C120 Show". At 6:05pm the tape was interrupted by a very "live" Tony Hennessey, who said he would be carrying on till the equipment packed up. By 8:10pm the station seemed to be carrying continuous music, presumably taped. By 9:13pm they were back with scheduled programmes and heard were:- 9:13-11pm Martin Miller; 11pm-Midnight close-down Mark Newman. The Saturday schedule is a little confused, due to the number of people in the studio at any given time. Heard were:- 9am-11am Dave Collins; 11am-?? Paul James. The latter said that as DJ Charles was to follow him, they had decided on a "middle-bit" joint show. He signed-off at 11:51am, leaving Keith the Chief and A.N.Other to continue. By 1:30pm DJC and Paul James were conducting a joint show. From 4pm the schedule had settled down to a near normal and heard were:- 4pm-6pm Keith the Chief without Paul Woods; 6pm-8pm Tara; 8pm-10pm Martin Miller; 10pm-Midnight Mark Newman; Midnight-?? Keith the Chief. KTC was scheduled Midnight-1am, to be followed by Ian Jones, another new DJ, from 1am-2am close-down, but the latter was not noted. The Sunday schedule was:- 9am-11am Dave Collins; 11am-1pm Wayne Scott (another ex-SCR DJ); 1pm-3pm Paul Jay; 3pm-5pm Burt Williams; 5pm-7pm Keith the Chief; 7pm-10pm Martin Miller; 10pm-Midnight Mark Newman; 12 midnight- 1am(??) Keith the Chief.
