STORETON COMMUNITY RADIO 1026kHz: 91, New Hey Road, Woodchurch Estate, Birkenhead, Merseyside L49 7NE
Please note the new mailing address.

The station is now announcing Thur/Fri/Sat/Sun operation but the Thursday schedule has not been noted yet. On Friday, the only change to the regular schedule was Paul Western standing-in for Mike Martyn between midnight and 2am. The opened on Saturday with Andy Rogers standing-in for Joe Williams between 8am and 10am. The station closed-down at 10am, re-opening at 7pm. The reason was that the SCR DJs were running an all-day (10am-7pm) disco at a carnival in Birkenhead Park. From 7pm the schedule read:- 7pm-10pm Stevie Sounds (from announcements it seems that this is the same presenter who was on SCR previously); 10pm-Midnight Jill Jackson; Midnight-2am Martin "C"/Jeff Jones joint show. On Sunday the regular Joe Williams/Kenny "G"/Andy Sloane/Nick Stafford/Brian "C"/Larry James/Mike Martyn/Mad Mike line-up was noted and the station closed down at about 2:15am after some joint announcements by the latter two DJs. The station are announcing a special Bank Holiday Monday broadcast.

KISS-FM: 102.7MHz stereo FM: 150, Rake Lane, Wallasey, Merseyside L45 1JW

The station extended their hours this Sunday and heard were:- Noon-1pm Allan Ross; 1pm-3pm Tony Hayes; 3pm-6pm Colin Sayer and 6pm-8pm close-down Roy Stannier. The format is still "All-America music" and the standard of presentation is very high. Tony Hayes mentioned that this station may also be presenting a Bank Holiday Monday broadcast.

RADIO MERSEY WAVES 1242kHz: 9, Meadfoot Rd, Moreton, Wirral, Merseyside L46 7UW

This station was on the air on Monday, but the day-time line-up was not noted. Heard were 5pm-7pm Paul Baker; 7pm-10pm Martin Miller; 10am-Midnight Dave Collins. The late night schedule wasn't noted, On Friday the line-up was:- 8am-11am Dave Collins; 11am-1pm DJC; 1pm-3pm Paul James; 3pm-5pm Paul Woods; 5pm-8pm Martin Miller; 8pm-10pm Paul Baker; 10pm-11pm Dave Collins. The remainder of the schedule was announced as: 11pm-1am Mark Newman; 1am-2am DJC, but after 11pm only the carrier was noted, and this was still on the air at 1:35am. The Saturday schedule was:- 9am-Noon(?) Dave Collins; Noon-2pm Paul James; 2pm-4pm DJC; 4pm-6pm Paul Woods; 6pm-8pm Paul Jay (continuous music at first); 8pm-10:30pm Mark Newman; 10:30-Midnight Ian Jones; Midnight-1am Mark Newman. Later announcements say that the station was also on 94.8MHz FM on Saturday night but that signal strength monitoring had produced disappointing results. Heard Sunday were, 9am-11am Dave Collins; 11am-1:30pm Wayne Scott; 1:30pm-3pm Paul Jay tape; 3pm-5pm Burt Williams; 5pm-7pm Paul Woods; 7pm-8pm DJC/Martin Miller; 8pm-10pm Martin Miller; 10pm-Midnight Mark Newman; Midnight-2am was announced as DJC, but he was still on the after the announced close-down time.
