The good news this weekend is that Central Radio International returned to the airwaves and the not so good news is that their equipment failed to last the weekend

CENTRAL RADIO INTERNATIONAL 1404kHz: 18, Glynne Street, Orrell, Bootle, Merseyside L20 6DF

The station was noted at 4:56pm on Saturday, when they appeared to be "testing" with some old Phil Davies Show tapes and jingles. The transmission was intermittant and was not on the air at 5:50pm. However they were heard at 6:12pm, with Phil Davies saying that they were going off the air till 8pm, when Jeff Thompson would be "in the hot seat" until midmight. At 8pm, John Sanderson's show was in progress. From 9:50pm, Jeff Thompson took over till the 12:44am close-down. On Sunday the first part of the schedule was:-10am-Noon Jim Browne; Noon-2pm Phil Davies; 2pm-4pm Jim Lowe; 4pm-6pm Tom Webb. After 6pm things started to go wrong. The DJ between 6pm and 7pm sounded like John Sanderson, but no name was heard. Between 7pm and 8pm, Shaun spent some time talking to himself as not too much speech was transmitted at times. The following DJ seemed most reluctant to give his name, which wasn't heard at all. He spent even more time talking to himself before it became apparent that there was a serious fault with the mic. As the evening wore on, more and more speech was lost and at approximately 9:45pm all modulation ceased although the carrier was still on the air at 12:10am

RADIO MERSEY WAVES 1242kHz; 9, Meadfoot Road, Moreton, Wirral, Merseyside L46 7UW.

The station was on the air on Friday but weren't noted until 6:10pm. Heard were:- 6:10pm-7pm Mark Newman; 7pm-10pm Tara; 10pm-Midnight Tony Coltrane; Midnight-lam Dave Collins and lam-3am DJC.
