## MERSEYSIDE FREE RADIO SCHNE Week ending Sunday 16th November 1986

This week, Central Radio have returned to 1404kHz and are presumably blocking out Radio Caroline North, who haven't been noted. Another unheard station is Radio Julie, who are reported to be having location difficulties. A couple of stations have been noted operating above 105MHz, but I am unable to give an accurate frequency read-out. RADIO MERSEY WAVES 1242kHz: 9, Meadfoot Road, Moreton, Wirral, Merseyside L46 7UW. CENTRAL RADIO 1404kHz: 30 Elkstone Road, Norris Green, Liverpool L11 2TD

This station was first noted with a very good signal at 10:52am Saturday, after apparently signing on at 10am. The announced schedule is Sat/Sun 10am-Midnight, but for the moment they don't seem to have sufficient DJs to fulfill these hours. Noted were:SAT: 10am(?) The staff of this station intend to "go their own ways" as well as keeping this station going.

CONCEPT RADIO 104.3MHz: 30, Elkstone Road, Norris Green, Liverpool L11 2TD On Sunday, this station was noted from 6:31pm with a very intermittant signal consisting of continuous music. Programming proper began shortly before 7pm and either heard or announced were:-

SUN: 7pm(?) Keith; 8:15pm Jim Lowe; 10:15pm Tom Webb; Midnight Webb & Lowe Show; 2am C/L The station were hoping to hold a late-night link-up with KDA but it wasn't verified whether or not this took place.

CDFM - RADIO COMMODORE: 105.3MHz(?)

On Monday night, a station was reporting to be operating on approximately 105.3MHz, which couldn't be heard at this location. However, on Wednesday night, a very weak, unreadable signal was noted on this approximate frequency from 8:30pm. By the time a better aerial had been rigged up, the station was playing continuous rock music, which disappeared from the airwaves without any DJ name or statation ID being noted. On Sunday, two stations were noted near to this frequency from 10:20pm The first station was announcing as "test transmissions" of CDFM, with Max Hamilton in the hot-seat, and other DJs Kevin Rogers and Eddie Lamb. It was suffering slight interference from a station on a higher frequency and closed down at 11pm. The other station, approximately 300kHz higher in frequency, were putting in a very poor signal with slight interference from CDFM. The music was quite good, but speech was very difficult to follow. It was quite loud at times but seemed to be over-modulated to the point of unreadability. The details are by no means certain, but the station seemed to be ID'ing as Radio Commodore, with Mike Hughes, who was still on the air at 11:20pm last listen. It was hoped that reception after 11pm, with CDFM off the air, would be clearer, but this proved not to be the case. They were organising a phone-in, but apart from 644, the remainder of the number wasn't heard. 

Phil Davies reports that Liverpool Pirate Radio will be back on the air shortly. They hope to run their own programmes on Sunday afternoon, then to relay Radio Veronica in the evening
