RADIO MERSEY WAVES 1242kHz: 9, Meadfoot Road, Moreton, Wirral, Merseyside L46 7UW This station are announcing their Friday transmissions as "test" broadcasts in preparation for the weekend. Noted this week have been:-

CENTRAL RADIO INT 1404kHz; 30, Mikstone Read, Norris Green, Liverpeel L11 2TD.

This station were noted with a very strong signal and not too many problems with the mic, as over the past few weekends. They are however, short of DJs, with Charles Browne reporting "sick" on Sunday and Chris Peters failing to turn up on the same day.

This station opened late on Sunday due to the "unavailability" of Keith, but the other DJs extended their hours to keep the station on the air till lam or so.
Sun: 7:30pm Cont. music; 8pm Jim Lowe; 10:30pm Tom Webb; lam(?) c/down
This station always used to feature a local Free Radio news section sometime during the evening, but these days, they also seem to be hearing very little and are more or less confined to saying "Hello" to the stations that used to be on the air. This week, Dave Moore made a short appearance, but I didn't hear any plans for his own station's return.

CAROLINE NORTH 1323kHz: 18, Glynne Street, Orrell, Bootle, Merseyside L20 6DF.

Jim Browne rang on Saturday to say that Caroline North and Supreme Radio had combined for future Sunday daytime broadcasts and that the station would be on the air from 9am the following day. They weren't noted until 12:40pm as they actually operated on 1323kHz, where they could only be heard during "fading" of Radio Norway's colossal signal (1200kW) on 1415kHz. The line-up was said to be:-

They were last noted here at approximately 2:40pm, after which, it is believed that they may have moved to 1357kHz. For a while after 3pm, a "het" was noted slightly low frequency of Manx Radio on 1368kHz. The station are planning a special Christmas Eve (all day) broadcast and hope to have one of the cast of TV's BROOKSIDE programme as a special guest

SUPREME RADIO 105.0MHz: 18, Glynne Street, Orrell, Bootle, Merseyside L20 6DF. Jim Browne says that this station operates Sundays only with:—Sun: 6pm John Martin; 9pm Dave Starr; Midnight c/down.
They haven't been noted at this location

MERSEY SOUND 103.8MHz: No mailing address.

Jim Browne says that this station is on the air every night from 9pm or so until

4am. He hasn't noted any DJ names and the station doesn't give out any contact address.

They are not heard here due to BBC LANCS' very strong signal on 103.9MHz
