MERSEYSIDE FREE RADIO SCENE Week ending Sunday 25th January 1987

Some big changes have taken place this week, even though only three stations have been heard on the air.

RADIO MERSEY WAVES: 1242kHz: 9, Meadfoot Road, Moreton, Wirral, Merseyside LA6 70W This station was noted at 8:05am on Friday with a "test transmission" of continuous music till 11:30am. At 10pm on that day they didn't have a DJ available, so after a brief announcement by Burt Williams, they played continuous music till Peter Thomas turned up. On Sunday they disappeared from the air around 4:45pm and with Radio Julie having disappeared half an hour earlier, things began to look ominous. However, the carrier was intermittantly on the air around 5:15pm and broadcasting began again at 5:30pm they say that technical problems had kept them off the air for half an hour or so. They have also extended their Sunday evening broadcast with Paul James and "B" doing a 2am to 4am slot. Noted this week have been:-

CENTRAL RADIO INT 1404kHz: 30, Elkstone Road, Norris Green, Liverpool Lll 2TD. All doesn't seem well at this station, with grievances beginning to surface over the air. On quite a few occasions during his show, Tom Webb announced that the station would be closing down om Sunday 25th January for a period of four weeks, and that Dave Moore would be joining the station when it returned to the airwaves. He was immediately followed by Fhil Davies who said that now the station was putting out a good signal and getting back its lost listeners, there was no way that the station would go off the air unless it was raided by the DTI. Furthermore, he told Dave Moore over the air that if he failed to turn up this week, he needn't bother turning up in the future as the station was looking for reliable DJs. He then sent out a warning to those concerned that a constant watch would be kept on the stations equipment to ensure that none of it was transferred to the other side of the river. Noted were:-

Dave Moore failed to show up for the third week on the trot and on Sunday, Price and Palmer didn't cover for him.

RADIO JULIE FM 104.8MHz: "Casita", 78 Barnston Road, Thingwall, Wirral, Merseyside 161 7XW This station were the surprise of the week. After announcing "Sunday only" operation, they were noted shortly after 8am on Thursday morning. Station announcements made it clear that they are now operating a 7-day, 24hr schedule with just four DJs and a couple extra at the weekend. The regular DJs are Andy Davies, Tony West, Phil Smith and Steve Mason with Feona Beswick and Neil Bishop(always in the studio but never on the air) at the weekend. This Sunday they disappeared from the airwaves sometime betwen 4:05pm and 4:25pm but were back again at 6pm, saying that they had had technical problems. After this, they seem to have been announcing their schedule as 24hr, Fri/Sat/Sun/Mon. My pocket-portable, on which I rely for weekday reception, won't pick up indoor reception of Radio Julie, either in Wallasey or Liverpool, although outdoor reception is quite good in the latter location. This makes it impossible for me to check the station's schedule. However, Steve Mason says that the station's schedule is rarely adhered to, so it isn't worth printing announced names and times. Other sources have told me that this station actually started their 24hr, 7-day schedule last Monday.
