RADIO JULIE 104.8MHz stereo FM; "Casita", 78, Barnston Road, Thingwall, Wirral, This station was first noted back on the air Merseyside, L61 7XJ from 11:20am on Saturday. They appear to be operating continuously till 6am on Monday morning, although their proposed opening time hasn't been heard. RADIO MERSEYLAND 1395kHz: 18, Glynne Street, Orrell, Bootle, Merseyside L20 6DF.

News from Jim Browne is that this station was on the air every day between 10am and mid-day with Mark Evans in the hot seat. Around Noon, he did a short link-up with Phil Davies at Liverpool Pirate Radio, and that the latter station then stayed on the air for a couple of hours. Both stations are too weak to be heard from my workplace. The station is announcing 8am-5pm on Sundays, but that they were closing down early this week due to circumstances beyond their control.

LIVERPOOL PIRATE RADIO 1404kHz: 30, Elkstone Road, Norris Green, Liverpool, L11 2TD. This station announced that they were on the air on Saturday, but weren't noted here. They were first noted from 9:45am on Sunday with intermittant music and sign-on at 10am. Phil Davies was in the hot seat till 11:20am close down, when he apparently went over to Radio Merseyland, where he said a few words during Jim Browne's show.

RADIO MERSEY WAVES 1242kHz: 9, Meadfoot Road, Moreton, Wirral, Merseyside L46 7UW. The signal from this station has been very poor in relation to their normal signal and continental interference has been a problem. The ex-Radio City DJ failed to materialise at 6pm on Saturday, with other DJs extending their hours to "cover up".
