MERSEYSIDE FREE RADIO SCENE

Week ending Sunday 3rd May 1987

This week has seen the return of a couple of well-known "Voices from the past" in the form of Chuck Brogan on Liverpool Pirate Radio and Jeff Stone on Radio Merseyland. The date fixed for Andy Davis, of Radio Julie to receive his sentence is 19th May and it is believed that Radio Mersey Waves are also due in court on the same day. Reception at work of Central Radio and Radio Julie isn't possible, so most of Friday's schedules for both these stations was missed. Working in a well earthed steel cage,

most of the signals heard on the radio originate from the air-conditioning system and

the printing machinery on the floor above.

SLAG-OFF INTERNATIONAL 105.2MHz: 132, Norwood Road, Poulton, Wallasey, Merseyside L44 4EG This station was noted from 3:45pm on Sunday after apparently coming on the air with carrier only at 3:20pm, followed by mainly continuous music with occasional background chat from Mike Hughes and "Maca" till 4pm, when "Maca" did a show of his own till 6pm close-down. This is the only time that the station has been noted this week CONCEPT RADIO 104.3MHz: 13, Kipling Avenue, Rock Ferry, Birkenhead, Merseyside L42 2DH Note the new mailing address for this station which may not be unfamiliar to regular listeners in this area. The station was on the air from 7pm on Sunday but the whole schedule wasn't noted. Heard were:-

For the past two Sundays, Tom Webb, in his local Free Radio News, has been featuring extracts of the other local stations but already there are accusations of deliberate "de-tuning" of the receiver before the recorder is run. From messages sent out on Sunday, it seems that Commodore Radio had been on the air sometime during the week and signal strength reports were put out to them on Sunday evening.

CENTRAL RADIO INT 1404kHz: 30, Elkstone Road, Norris Green, Liverpool L11 2TD. This station was noted for approximately 10 minutes around 12:15pm on Friday and Jim Browne provided the following schedule:-

LIVERPOOL PIRATE RADIO 1404kHz: 30, Elkstone Road, Norris Green, Liverpool L11 2TD This station was heard with a weak signal from approximately 9:30am on Sunday with official sign-on at 10am with:-

Sun: 10am Phil Davies; 1:30pm Paul Jones; 4pm Chuck Brogan; 6pm Phil Davies; 6:15pm c/d. It is so long since I last heard Chuck Brogan's voice on LPR that I can't be sure if this is the same Chuck Brogan who was a DJ with them in the past, although station announcements suggest that this is so.

RADIO MERSEYLAND 1422kHz: 18, Glynne Street, Orrell, Bootle, Merseyside L20 6DF Apologies for getting the address of this station wrong last week when the postal district got mixed up with the house number. They were on the air on Sunday and featured a not too successful Outside Braodcast "due to circumstances beyond our control" as they say. For reasons I won't go in to too closely, as the crowd gathered, the mobile reporter in the shape of Mark Evans was "moved on" by the police till he was no longer able to supply a reasonable signal to the FM link back to the studio. They had planned to run the OB between 4pm and 6pm, but they had to abandon the project at 5:15pm. Noted were:-

This station was on the air from 7pm on Sunday without any pre-transmission "tones" being noted. Heard were:-

RADIO JULIE 104.8MHz(s): 112, Greenwood Road, Woodchurch, Wirral, Merseyside L49 8HU As stated in the "intro", this station can not be heard at work, so much of their Friday schedule is missed before 6pm. For the rest of the weekend, the DJs only announce details of the DJs to follow and most of these announcements are made without warning and at a speed that makes it impossible to write down. It isn't known whether they are still operating a 24hr format over the weekend, but heard or announced have been:Fri:: 6pm Mark Ross; 8pm DJ Cressey; 10pm Phil Smith; Midnight Paula "P";

There are very strong rumours circulating around the Merseyside area that after 7:30pm on Monday 4th May, this station will actually feature some music in their format!! The reason for them going off the air rather suddenly at 10:40pm last Sunday was put down to technical problems and Dave Collins has since said that the studio had been completely rebuilt. They developed more problems on Tuesday, when they went off the air at 1pm. Listeners were advised to tune to FM, but this latter signal wasn't heard. The medium wave carrier was back at 7:10pm followed by intermittant modulation till just before 9pm, when they were back to normal. Noted have been:-

The station's combined Under 18/Over 18 Night-Out takes place at SNOBS 2 in Liverpool on Monday 4th May. This function, together with details of bus tickets and cheap taxis must have been advertised on the station at least ten million times over the past four or five weeks. This past week, even some of the DJs have refused to advertise it any more as they themselves were sick and tired of hearing about it!

DEPARTMENT OF Trade and Industry officers investigated after radio transmissions were picked up coming from a flat at Ford Towers, Birkenhead. A search warrant was obtained and radio equipment was found in one room and transmitting material in another room, Mr Sean Sexton, prosecuting, told Wirral magistrates.

Andrew William Dobbing, who was present, admitted operating under the disc jockey name of Andy Davies and the equipment was seized.

Six months later, said Mr Sexton, more transmissions were discovered coming from a flat at Heatherlands, Woodchurch, with the call sign Radio Julie FM used. Again equipment was seized. Dobbing admitted operating the equipment which he said had been installed in December.

Dobbing, 22, living at Heatherlands, admitted two offences of using apparatus for wireless telegraphy without a licence and one of installing apparatus for wireless telegraphy

without a licence.

The magistrates said they were concerned at the continuation of broadcasts by Dobbing after he was first seen and interviewed in August. They asked for a social inquiry report and adjourned sentence until May 19.

Mr Sexton asked that some of the equipment seized be forfeited. He also claimed £200 costs.

Mr Stephen McPeake, defending, said Dobbing was a self-taught electronic enthusiast. He broke the law but not for his own gain, He was unemployed and it was a way of occupying his time.

Mr McPeake said there was no evidence of interference being caused by the station which had benefited local charities by advertising events which were taking place.
