This station was already on the air when checked at 5:50pm on Sunday. They say that from next weekend they may have at least one more DJ and are hoping to open up earlier.

On Friday they announced that they would be "testing" another frequency after 5pm, but nothing was found. On either Saturday or Sunday, Steve Bishop said that it had been a busy ll days, inferring that Radio Atlantis had been on the air every day, but nothing was noted here. On Sunday, the station was off the air for a few minutes shortly after 5pm. When they returned at 5:20pm, Rick Dane apologised for the break in transmission, saying that they were having problems with someone from one of the other local stations and asking the "minders" to come round straight away. He said that all Atlantis were trying to do was run a free radio station and leave others to get on with running theirs. Phil Davies did two early morning shows for them, but it is possible that some of the other DJs may have left. Tony West, who was asked over the air to call at the studio was heard on Radio Julie on Saturday afternoon and also from Midnight Saturday, when he was supposed to be doing a joint-show with "Roy". SLAG-OFF INT: 105.3 FM(s): 132, Norwood Road, Poulton, Wallasey, Merseyside L44 4EG This station was only noted once this week and as normal, the scnedule was difficult to determine. They were first heard at 4:15pm on Sunday with one side of a CB conversation between Mike Hughes and an unknown person, with the occasional record. The broadcast was announced as a "test" transmission that would end shortly and be back on the air with proper programming later. In the event, they seem to have been on the air continuously, with continuous music giving way to the Mike Hughes Show at some indefinite time prior to 7pm. From 8pm, Steve Mason was "in the hot seat", saying that he would be on the air till 2am, or maybe later. Close-down time wasn't noted

## Cruel sea

RADIO Laser, the pirate station that had been anchored in the Thames Estuary, has become the victim of pirates.
