Only four stations have been noted this week and three of these have had varying degrees of technical problems.

RADIO MERSEY WAVES: 1242kHz: 9, Meadfoot Road, Moreton, Wirral, Merseyside L46 7UW The signal from this station hasn't bee too good for the past couple of weeks and this week all the problems came to a head. On Monday night the signal became very intermittant around midnight and went off the shortly afterwards. No "test transmission" was noted on Thursday night and the station failed to appear on the air till 7:30pm on Friday, when an un-modulated carrier was noted. The carrier seems to have been on the continuously till 5pm on Saturday, when programming began. The problems continued and for the rest of the weekend there was a very nasty "buzz" over all speech which didn't improve in spite of numerous attemps to correct it. Noted were:-

RADIO JULIE 104.8 FM(s): 112, Greenwood Road, Woodchurch, Birkenhead, Merseyside L49 8HU. Although the signal sounded very good in Liscard, the station were off the air at times with short "breaks" for adjustments. Noted this week were:-

In his show on Saturday, Neil Bishop announced that he and a few of the other Radio Julie DJs would shortly be putting their own station on the air, while maintaining their links with Radio Julie. They expect the new station to be 105.5MHz and probably operate on Tuesday and Wednesday evenings. Its name is planned as Horizon Radio. RADIO ATLANTIS 936kHz: 150, Rake Lane, Liscard, Wallasey, Merseyside L45 1JW. For the first hour on Monday morning the signal was very intermittant, but after this there didn't appear to be any further problems. On Sunday they extended their hours,

opening at 9am with Mike Hayes, of Radio Hexagon International doing a "guest appearance" and presenting an "oldies" programme. After 8pm on Sunday they relayed Radio Julie, but after 9pm the relay was barely heard under the co-channel interference. Close-down time wasn't noted but is thought to have been 10:15pm. This station have announced that they will shortly be operating on three days per week on increased power, but no further details were given CONCEPT RADIO 104.3MHz: 13, Kipling Avenue, Rock Ferry, Birkenhead, Merseyside L42 2DH This station tell me that contrary to reports I may have heard in the various "Free Radio" news on other stations, their Sunday transmissions are irregular and that there are still many things to be sorted out. Also, the prospect of a Mai outlet isn't as imminent as others may have suggested

RADIO VERONICA (104.7) and SLAG-OFF INT haven't been noted at all this week.
