MERSEYSIDE FREE RADIO SCENE

Week ending Sunday 8th August 1987
Technical problems and DTI activity have disrupted many programmes this week although a new, but as yet unidentified, station was noted on Thursday evening.

RADIO ATLANTIS 936kHz: 150, Rake Lane, Liscard, Wallasey, Merseyside L45 1JW
On Monday this station opened at 5pm instead of llam. They reported DTI activity in the area and say that they changed location yet again. At 8pm they changed frequency to 1197kHz, but with a much weaker signal. On Sunday they changed to 1395kHz at 8pm but this frequency is a disaster due to Radio Tirana, Albania. Noted were:

On Saturday the station still wasn't on the air by noon and they weren't heard opening up, so no explanation as to Friday's absence was heard although the late start on Sun was put down to technical problems

RADIO MERSEY WAVES; 1242kHz: 9, Meadfoot Road, Moreton, Wirral, Merseyside L46 70W This station also had a lot of problems. On Monday they suffered breakthrough of BBC Merseyside all day. Steve Coltrane finished his show 15 minutes early, having "had enough" of the break-through and also the "swish and click" interference that appeared over his programme at six second intervals. Peter Thomas took over, saying that one of the transmitter valves was on its last legs. He kept the station going for as long as possible, but it was off the air by 9:45pm. On Friday they opened at 7am but from 2:30pm they seemed to be suffering from jamming, but voices in "noise" suggested that the FM link was suffering interference from CBers. They closed-down "for ten minutes" but were not found again. On Saturday, they still weren't found by Moon, although they seem to have come on the air shortly after. They were first noted here at 2pm with a distorted and intermittant signal. Things were eventually sorted out by 3:35pm and have operated without any apparent problems since then. Noted have been:-

DTI-FM 106.2MHz No mailing address

This station was noted from 9:10pm on Tuesday on a frequency much nearer to 105.4Mhz than the amounced 106.2MHz although they were back on the correct frequency by the weekend. The current schedule is announced as Tues/Fri/Sat from 8pm to 11pm and noted this week has been:

Tue: 8pm(?) DJ Dave; 10:20pm DJ Phil...sudden off at 11:42pm but back very shortly with a very much weaker signal

Fri: 8pm DJ Phil; 9pm DJ Dave; 10pm DJ Phil; 11pm close-down

Sat: 8pm DJ Dave; 10pm DJ Phil; 11pm close-down

SLAG-OFF INT 105.3MHz: 9, Newell Road, Liscard, Wallasey, Merseyside L44 lAD
This station was heard on Sunday but the full schedule wasn't noted. They were first
found at 4pm with continuous music. Later, Mike Hughes amounced that he would keep
the continuous music on the air while he went off for something to eat, but some time
around 5pm, Mark Evans came on the air with a "live" show till 8:30pm, when Mike Hughes
took over. He started his show with a phone-in, and later was playing the requests. By
10:30pm, only the carrier was found and it isn't known if there was any more programming
after this time

RADIO VERONICA 104.7MHz: C/o 81, Lark Lane, Liverpool, L17 8UP
This station was noted with a weak signal from 1:30pm on Sunday, with Neil Frazer in the "hot seat". The signal is subject to a lot of fading and reception is difficult. The station was still on the air at 2:10pm, but couldn't be found at 2:45pm
UNIDENTIFIED

On Thursday evening a strong signal was noted from an un-noted time on approximately 107.7MHz. They were playing continuous Beatles music but suffering intermittant interference from the emergency services. They closed down without announcement
