On Wednesday, Rock Steady Eddie of Radio Merseyland was in Court on two charges: one of setting up the station and the other of operating it on one date. He was fined £50 on each charge and ordered to pay costs of £231. All cassettes and audio equipment was returned but the Court confiscated the transmitter and a mic. At the time of the raid. the station was broadcasting taped programmes and the feeling is that had they been operating "live", they wouldn't have got the decks back.

Locally, the Medium Wave stations put out very good signals during the daytime, but from 5:30pm or so they are increasingly swamped by the stations from the Continent and in this area they are difficult to find and hard to listen to for any length of time. This week has also seem a couple of unidentified signals on the FM band.

On Wednesday night a very strong signal was noted on this frequency with continuous music but it closed down after five minutes or so and wasn't heard again. It was back again on Thursday evening with a relay of ILR R.City, which seems to have been on the air all night. The relay was still on the air at 1:30pm on Friday, but had gone when checked at 4pm. This was possibly a test transmission for Wirral Community Radio who said that the station would open this weekend, but wasn't heard.

On Saturday night continuous music was noted on this frequency from 7:12pm. At 7:19pm the carrier was switched off. It was back again at 7:21pm, but remained un-modulated. This was possibly a "test broadcast" from North Coast Radio who are currently announcing 1350kHz only, with 104.8MHz FM to follow soon

RADIO ATLANTIS 1197kHz + 96.25MHz: 150, Rake Lane, Wallasey, Merseyside L45 1JW. This station are still announcing an FM frequency, but listeners in Liverpool, who have had excellent on FM in the past report that the station hasn't been heard on this band this week. As last week, the output seems to have consisted of repeats of Steve Bishop and Dave Ross shows tapes, so the printing of a schedule would be meaningless. On Monday they were not due on the air till "late" due to "essential maintenance" on the transmitters. In the event, they weren't found till 4:04pm with 5pm close-down. On Friday, they weren't on the air at llam and were first noted at 12:33pm after opening up at 12:30pm(?). Programmes were still taped but starting on the "half hour". At 4:30pm, Steve Bishop said he would be on the air for the next 2 hours, but at 6:30pm the station seems to have already closed-down. On Saturday the station opened at llam with the same Steve Bishop/Dave Ross tapes, but at 6:24pm a very "live" Steve Bishop closed the station down, due to "lack of staff". On Sunday, they failed to show up at llam, but were noted from 11:40 am with intermittant carrier and intermittant modulation till noon, when they featured another repeat of the 2-hr Steve Bishop show followed by a repeat of the 2-hr Dave Ross show till 4pm, when they apparently closed-down.

NORTH COAST RADIO 1350kHz: 18, Downham Drive, Heswall, Wirral, Merseyside L60 5RF After the early close-down last Sunday, this station failed to appear on Monday. They weren't found till 5:40pm on Friday, when reception after 8pm was difficult and it isn't known whether they completed the announced schedule. On Saturday the station wasn't found till 2:20pm, but apparently did stay on the air till 2am.
