MERSEYSIDE FREE RADIO SCENE Week ending Sunday 11th October 1987 Apologies to Liverpool Pirate Radio for omitting them from last week's notes when I should have reported that they were on the air on Saturday 3rd Oct for an hour long "test broadcast". Phil Davies tells me that he has been advised not to turn up in Court on 14th Oct, as his solicitor will be getting the case adjourned to a later date. The good news this week is that Radio Mersey Waves returned to the air and both Radio Atlantis and North Coast Radio got enough staff together to make themselves sound more like radio stations than they have over the past few weeks. The choice of Medium Wave frequincies used by the latter two stations make for some pretty grim reception, specially between 6pm and 8:30pm. 1197kHz carries the Voice of America programmes from Munich with 300kW, while 1350kHz carries French stations in Nancy and Nice, each with 100kW. RADIO MERSEY WAVES 1242kHz: 9, Meadfoot Road, Moreton, Wirral, Merseyside L46 7UW This station was back on the air on Sunday but weren't noted here till 10:20pm, with Don La One till llpm, followed by Mark Wright. Close-down time wasn't noted. Others tell me that they heard the station from approximately 5:15pm and they themselves were told that the station had been on the air all day. MERSEYSIDE FREE RADIO 105.9MHz: 24, Wilkes Avenue, Leasowe, Wirral, Merseyside L46 1SA.

This station was noted at llam sign-on on Sunday to 11:15pm. They were announcing an 11pm close-down during the day, but when the time came, Phil Headroom announced that he would be on the air for an hour or so, but at 11:17pm, he closed the station down. The crew of this station is a collection of DJs previously heard on Radio Julie, Mersey Waves, Slag-Off and DTI-FM, and is obviously the station calling itself Wirral CR who made a "test" broadcast on 26th Sept. When next spot-checked at 4pm, they were not on the air, and weren't heard again till 7pm. On Friday they weren't on air at llam and weren't found till 12:27pm after apparently sinning-on at noon. The weekend schedule seems to have gone as planned except for a few Dis not turning up and a bit of re-shuffling of the format.

MONDAY 12th October

I understand that in the 7am newscast, ILR RADIO CITY reported that a local pirate radio station had caused havoc to the emergency sevices all day on Sunday 11th october, with North West Gas being hardest hit by the broadcasts. A spokesman for the DTI said that they had so far been unable to pin-point the station concerned, but promised action on the matter in the near future. Later in the day, Radio Atlantis were off the air for a while due to DTI activity in their location, though they weren't responsible for the complaints:
