MERSEYSIDE FREE RADIO SCENE Week ending Sunday 22nd November 1987

It has been a very uneventful week with the usual stations operating as planned but with revised formats to cover for crew who are on holiday. Liverpool Pirate Radio seem to have found themselves in the midst of some very freakish propagation conditions on Sunday and were barely heard.

LIVERPOOL PIRATE RADIO 1404 + others: 30, Elkstone Road, Norris Green, Liverpool Lil 2TD. This station was thought to be on the air , just above 1404kHz, from about 10:35am on Sunday morning but conditions were so bad that no positive identification could be made. It wasn't till Phil rang for a reception report shortly after llam that "Riders in the Sky" was identified as the station, although speech remained unreadable. Radio Finland on 1404kHz weren't nearly as strong as normal, and had another station under them. However, LPR seem to have been wiped out by a "het" from an unidentified frequency slightly lower. A change to a lower frequency, which worked so well last weekend, proved to be "out of the fat and into the fire". Radio Nederland's "Happy Station", which is normally only heard on Sw, was blasting-in on 1395KHz and LPR was "buried" between them and an unidentified station with an "American Forces" format on a higher frequency that seemed to have been the unidentified station that had blocked them on the previous frequency. The only AFRTS station that I can find listed anywhere near these frequencies is AFRTS, Hofn, Iceland, who operate on 1400kHz with just 100m! No positive ID was obtained on the latter, but the Happy Station has never been heard on Mw either. Propagation conditions were exceptional, or the latest frequency changes of the year have seen the international broadcasters come down so low as to use "Home Service" frequencies that they have never used before
