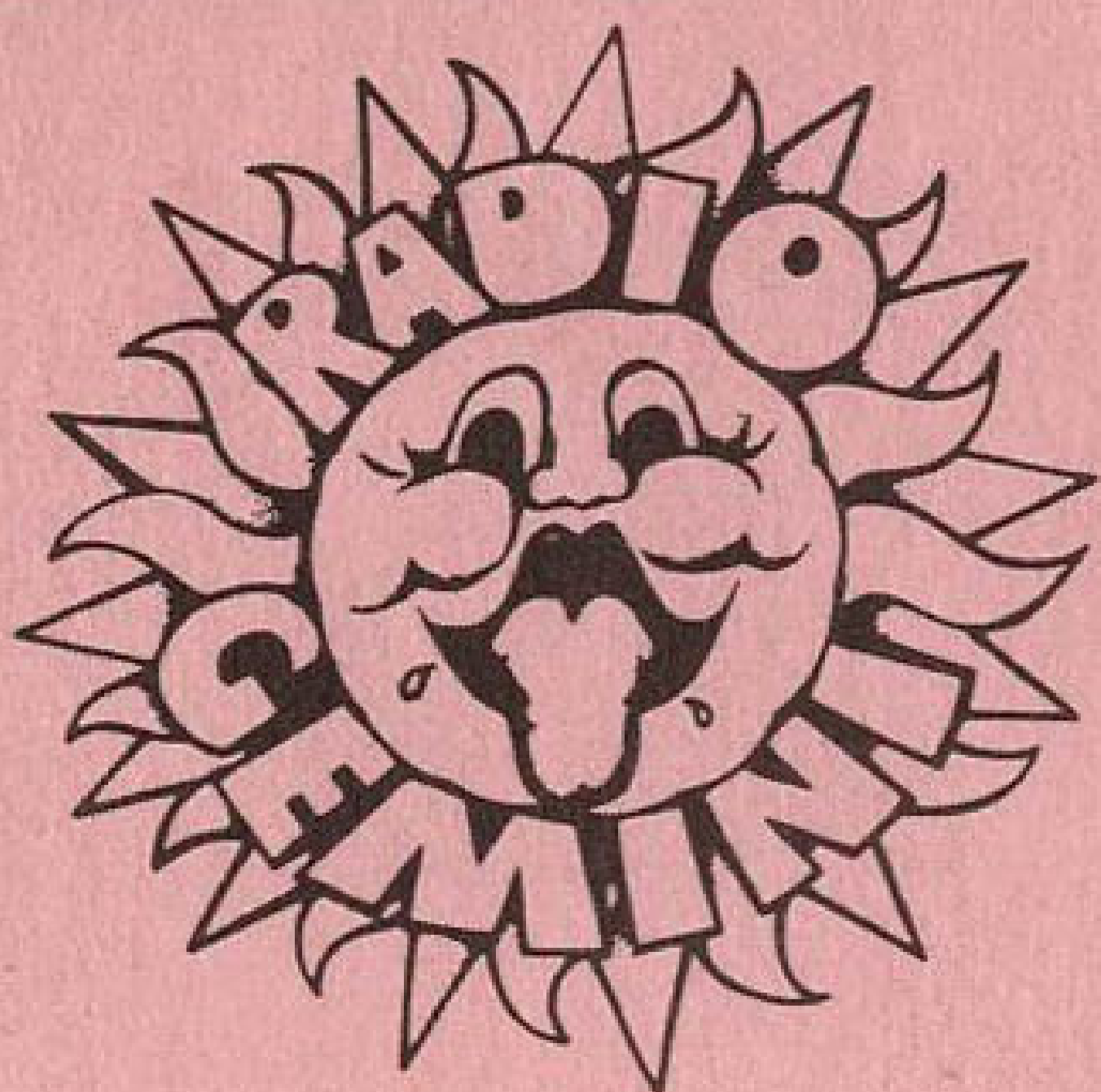
Radio Gemini has been broadcasting since November 1972 with a format based on 'not so well known records' and extracts from the past offshore radio stations. You can tune into Radio Gemini on 6230 Khz in the 49 metre band between 10.00 - 11.00 GMT on Sunday mornings.

The usual transmitter power is 150 watts and the programmes are prerecorded with a compressed characteristic to increase the average modulation depth.

The heart of the studio is 2 Revox A77 tape machines which together with AKG 202 mikes, Garrard record decks and other ancillary tape machines, enable the Gemini style of compilation show to be produced.

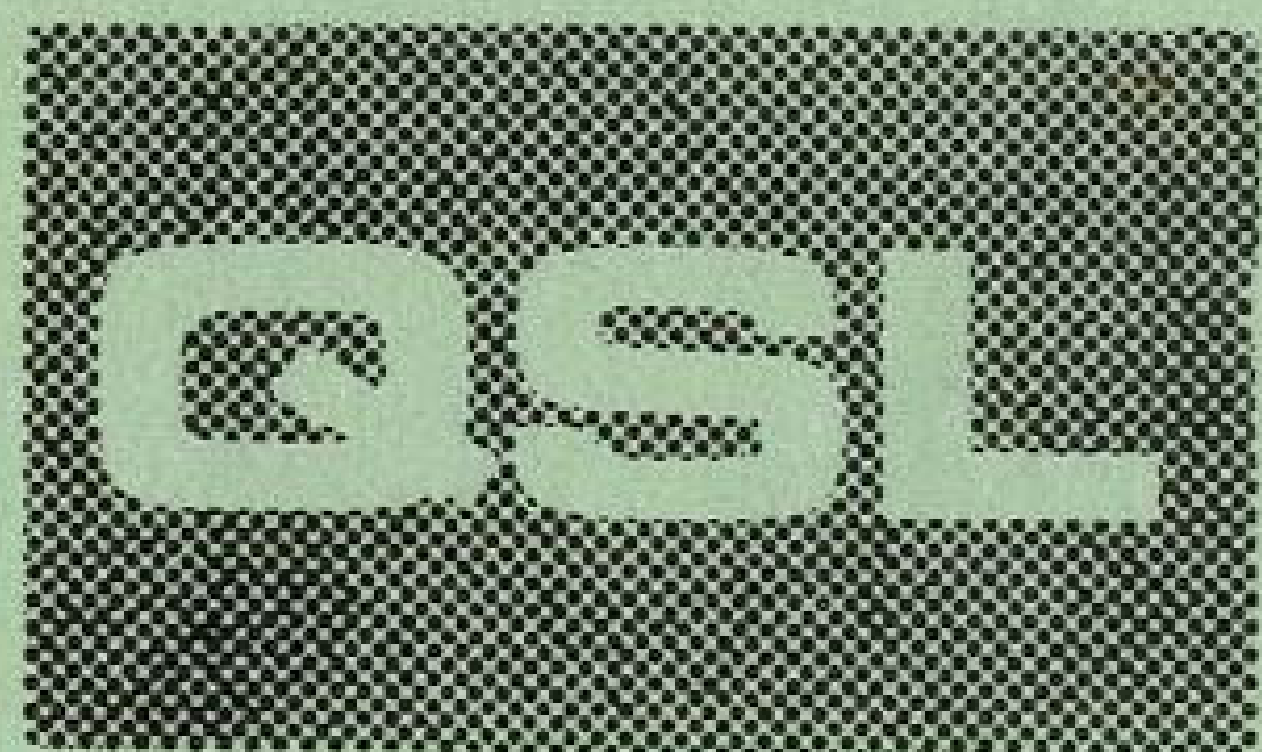

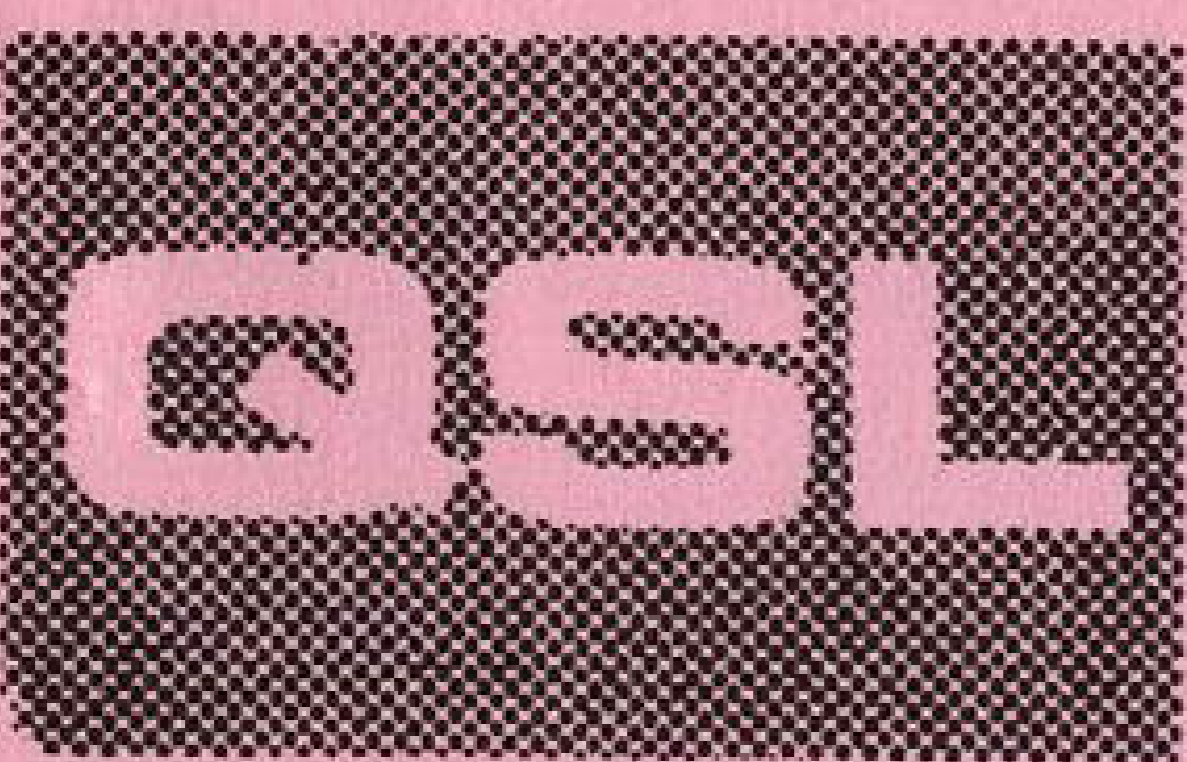

Radio Gemini has been broadcasting since November 1972 with a format based on "not so well known records" - comedy sketches - and extracts from past offshore radio stations. Radio Gemini does not broadcast regularly now, but when "on air" you can tune in on 6230kHz in the 49 metre band between 10.00 and 11.00 GMT on Sunday mornings.

The usual transmitter power is 150 watts and the studio equipment currently in use includes Fostex and Nakamichi tape machines (A4 & BX2), AKG microphones (D202), Dual record decks (505) and a Seck mixer (model 62).

The pre-recorded programmes are processed before transmission using graphic equalization (MXR) and audio compression (Fostex). The resulting increase in average modulation depth and hence signal to noise ratio, tends to compensate for the limited transmitter power.

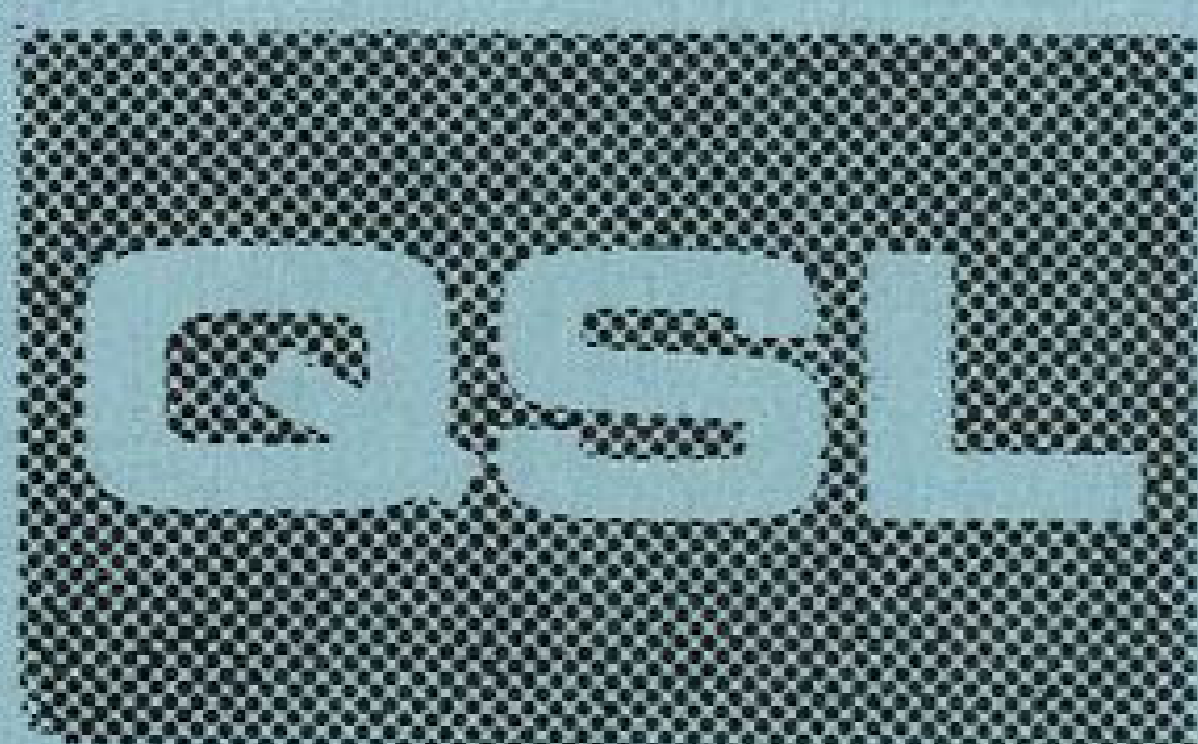

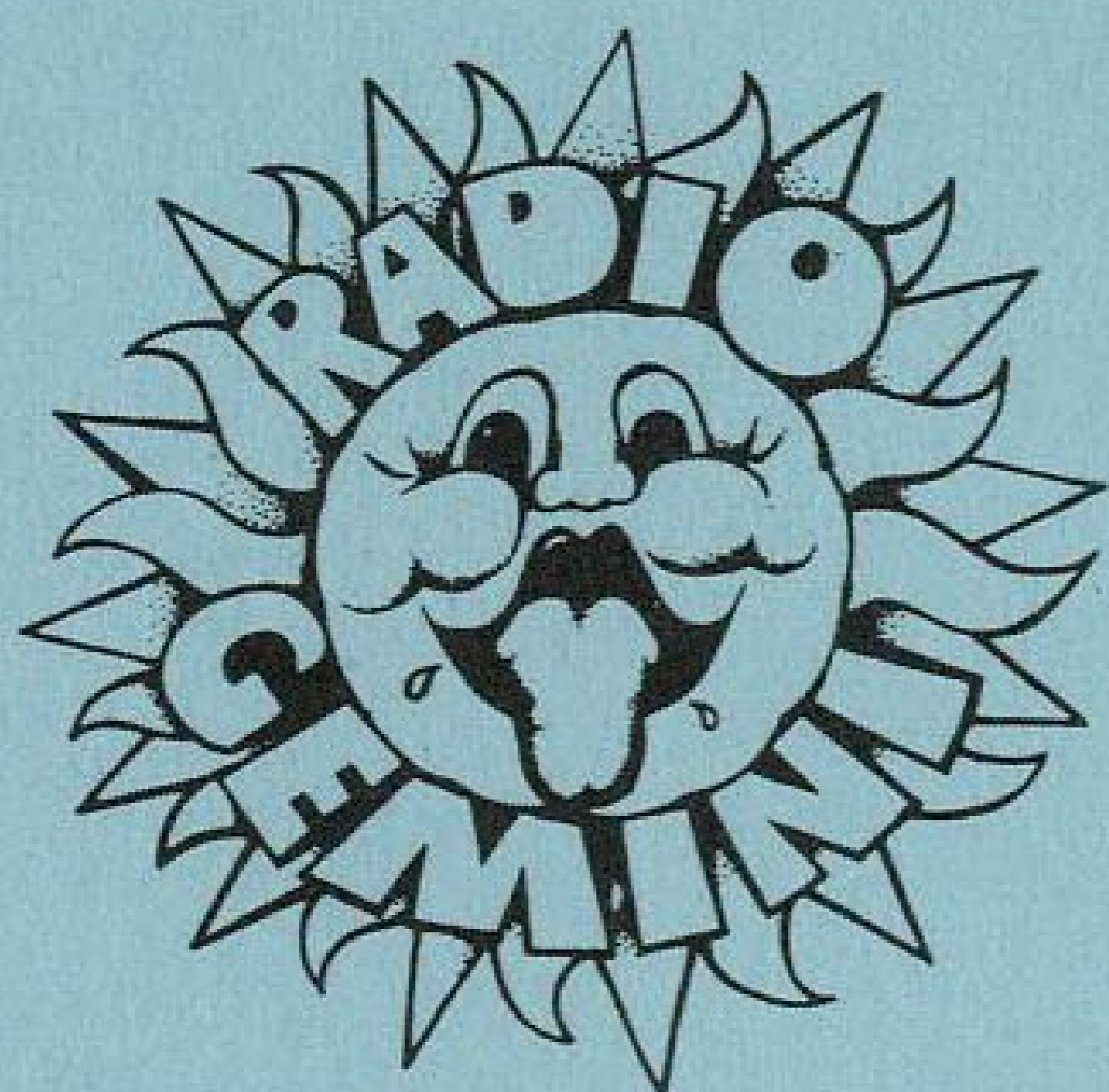
Radio Gemini has been broadcasting since November 1972 with a format based on 'not so well known records' and extracts from the past offshore radio stations. You can tune into Radio Gemini on 6230 KHz in the 49 metre band between 10.00 - 11.00 GMT on Sunday mornings.

The usual transmitter power is 150 watts and the studio equipment currently in use includes Revox tape machines (A77 B77), AKG microphones (202) and Garrard record decks (301).

The pre-recorded programmes are processed before transmission using graphic equalization (MXR), and audio compression (Ashly Audio). The resulting increase in average modulation depth and hence signal to noise ratio, tends to compensate for the limited transmitter power.
